## What is a conveyancer?

A conveyancer helps clients with property and business transfers. They ensure that the process of buying or selling property is done correctly and legally. Conveyancers prepare and advise on contracts, conduct title searches, handle mortgage documents, and manage financial and legal aspects of property transactions.

## What skills and strengths are needed?

A thorough understanding of property laws and financial regulations is essential. Conveyancers must have strong attention to detail and excellent organisational skills. They need to be good communicators to explain complex legal information to clients.

## What are the pathways?

You typically need an Advanced diploma in conveyancing combined with practical experience. University is also a pathway as in some states and territories, only solicitors can perform conveyancing work.

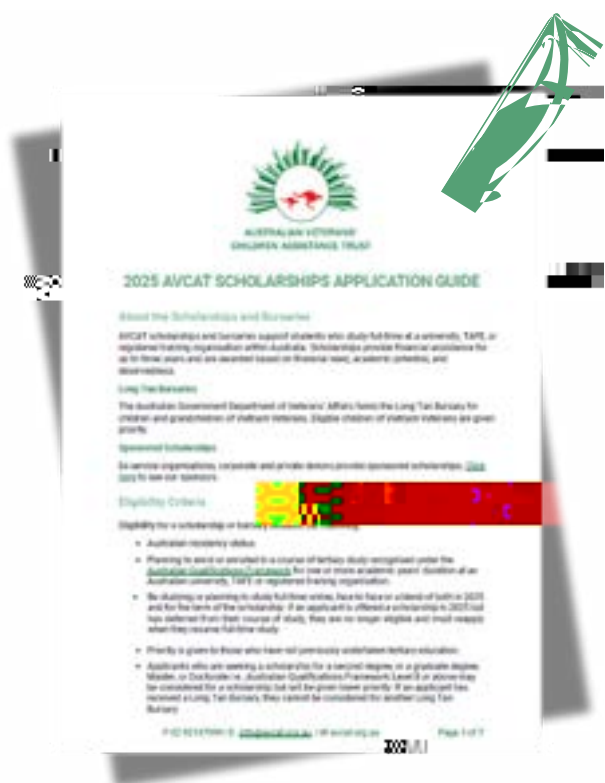

## 2025 AVCAT SCHOLARSHIPS APPLICATION GUIDE

### About the Scholarships and Benefits

AVCAT scholarships and benefits support students who study full-time at a university, TAFE, or registered training organisation (RTO) in Australia. Scholarships provide financial assistance for up to three years and are awarded based on financial need, academic potential, and citizenship.

### Long-Term Benefits

The Australian Government Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) funds the Long-Term Benefits for children and grandchildren of veteran veterans. Single children of veteran veterans are given priority.

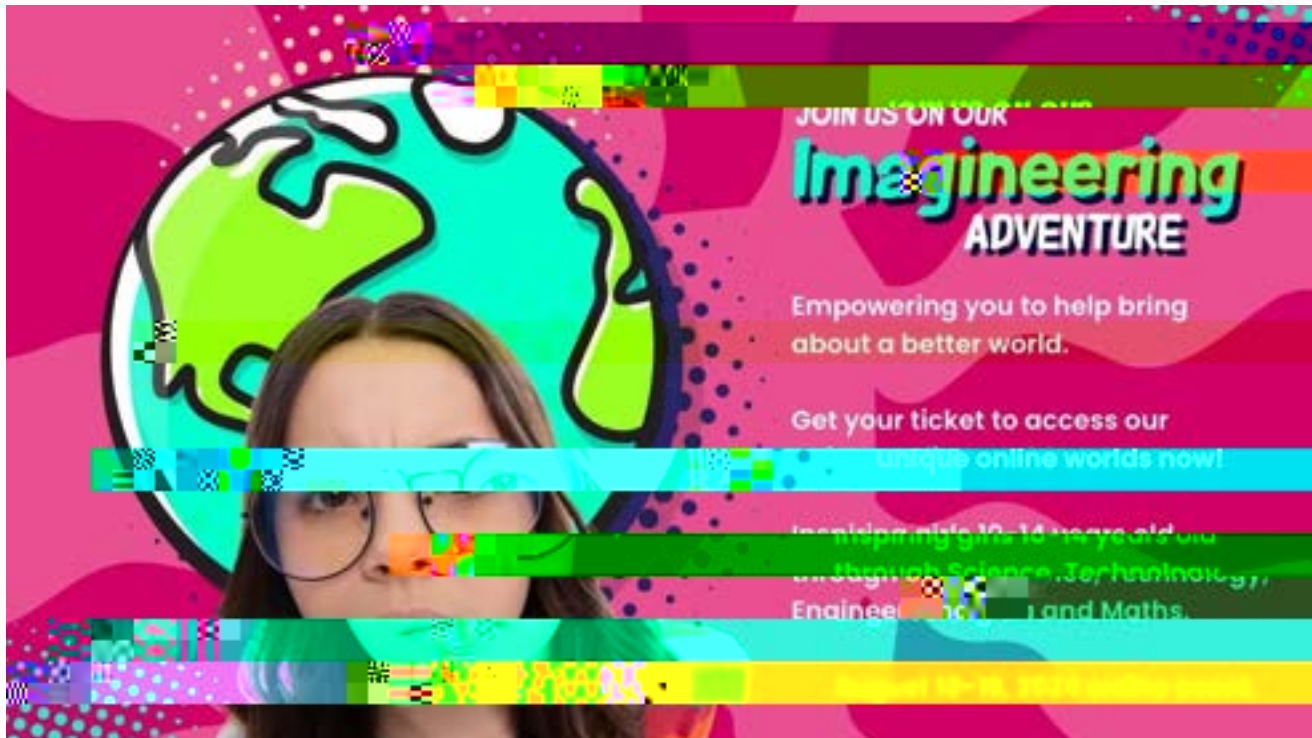
### Eligibility Criteria

#### Eligibility for a scholarship or benefit

- Australian residency status
- Planning to enrol or enrolled in a course of tertiary study recognised under the [Australian Qualifications Framework](#) for one or more academic years (duration of an Australian university, TAFE or registered training organisation)
- Be studying or planning to study full-time until the end of the year of birth in 2025 and for the term of the scholarship. If an applicant is offered a scholarship in 2023 but has not yet started their course of study, they are no longer eligible and must reapply when they receive full-time study.
- Priority is given for those who have not previously undertaken tertiary education.
- Applicants who are seeking a scholarship for a second degree, or a graduate degree (Master, or Doctoral or Australian Qualifications Framework Level 9 or above) may be considered for a scholarship but will be given lower priority. If an applicant has received a Long-Term Benefit, they cannot be considered for another Long-Term Benefit.
